*Travel to the **Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge** in Atlantic County to spot migratory bird species along the **8-mile Wildlife Drive**. This refuge protects more than **47,000 acres** of southern New Jersey and is home to thousands of migratory birds this winter. Spend an afternoon on the Wildlife Drive and see if you can spot some of the species listed below. If you have binoculars, they will definitely come in handy!*
